Tailwheel Scholarship

Overview

The Jason Brown Tailwheel Scholarship provides the opportunity for ground and flight training in a tailwheel aircraft at AeroDynamic Aviation. The scholarship provides a stipend of \$2,000.

Background

Jason Brown was the Assistant Chief Instructor at AeroDynamic Aviation. During his years with us, he inspired many pilots with his love of tailwheel flying. Jason passed away from an illness unexpectedly in early 2021. This scholarship was founded to promote tailwheel training in his honor.

Scholarship Information

This scholarship has a total value of \$2,000 to be used toward ground and flight training in a tailwheel aircraft. The scholarship may be awarded to any level of pilot, including student pilots, to be used for the following:

- Primary training in a tailwheel
- Tailwheel endorsement
- Spin & Upset training
- Basic Aerobatic training
- Back-country flying
- Mountain Flying training
- Tailwheel CFI training

Applicants will have 1 year to complete the training or the funds will be forfeited back to the Jason Brown Memorial Fund.

The scholarship application closes December 1st, 2022. The scholarship will be awarded each year on December 22, Jason's birthday.

- Must be a minimum 16 years of age before beginning training.
- Depending on instructor and aircraft, applicants are recommended to be under 190 pounds; however, we *may* be able to accommodate up to 210 pounds.
- Must have a current FAA student (or higher) pilot certificate
- Must have current medical if required by the airman's certificate
- Must complete and sign the application and submit the essay
